

Veneered Coffins – 1st January 2012

Simple yet traditional veneered wood coffins are the main stay of the British Funeral, they are the least expensive design and are selected for the majority of funerals that are cremation; they are also suitable for burial. A veneer of the wood (or sometimes a foil which is similar to wallpaper) is used over a fibreboard construction. This provides us with an inexpensive product that looks very respectable and has good strength.

The typical veneer is of Oak but others would include Elm (slightly darker with an attractive grain) or Mahogany (very dark, perhaps slightly red in colour). The design of the coffin is often quite plain but decoration can be made by panels to the sides and/or a raised tier to the lid. If you are inclined towards this relatively inexpensive choice of coffin, you should feel absolutely confident in your selection and not assuaged by any feelings of needing to upgrade.

Coffin 1 - Basic unpolished simulated Oak coffin with nickel plastic furniture and sidesheets; £225.00

Coffin 2 - Satin Finish, Veneered Oak Coffin with brasses plastic furniture and shroud; £290.00

Coffin 3 - Wax Polished, Veneered Oak Coffin with brasses plastic furniture and shroud; £325.00

Coffin 4 - Veneered Elm Coffin with panelled sides, brasses plastic furniture and shroud; £360.00

Coffin 5 - Polished Veneered Mahogany Coffin with panelled sides and tiered cover, brasses plastic furniture and gown set; £415.00

Coffin 6 - Wax Polished, Veneered Oak Coffin with panelled sides and tiered cover, brasses plastic furniture and gown set; £415.00
