Trokes Coppice is an ancient woodland that follows the stream along our southern boundary. It has been largely undisturbed for generations and we feel very responsible for keeping it as it should be. It is the home to a whole eco-system of flora and fauna. Pictured above is the coppice in late Spring when the woodland floor erupts with Bluebells creating a picture that defies words. It is possible to walk through Trokes Coppice and to enjoy its beauty but being a completely natural environment it must be remembered there are potential hazards to a visitor's safety; uneven ground, fallen trees to name but two. It must also be remembered that if this environment is to be protected for future enjoyment visitors must respect the need to leave the area as it was found. There are a limited number of Post and Rail fences upon which Brass Plaque Memorials may be purchased and we will allow a limited number of cremated remains to be scattered in this area each year.
